

## GROUP EVENTS

Families receive current child-development information and strategies to use while working with their children. Additionally, families acquire stress-reduction strategies, health and safety information, community resource connection information and incentives. All families, regardless of income, are invited to attend and spend meaningful time with their children.

## CRISIS ITEMS

Families receive Baby Bags, diapers, wipes, car seats, or other items needed to provide care and comfort to their children. Families also receive an informal needs assessment to ensure that other needed resources can be easily secured through partnering agencies.

Families in crisis with very young children are extremely susceptible to stress and depression. For this reason most, if not all, requests for crisis services are handled within 24 hours of the request being made.

## **CRIBS**

CRIBS (Community Resources, Infant Beds and Support) provides safe cribs for at-risk families who lack safe sleeping accommodations for their baby. The crib is delivered to the family home and is followed by an additional 5 home visits, which address whole family well-being discussions on: safe sleep, car-seat safety, child abuse and neglect reduction, nutrition, physical activity, smoking/substance usage, and increasing access to community resources.

## LEND & LEARN

Lend & Learn Toy Libraries provide a safe and inclusive location, where young children and their parents can explore toys in all domains of development. Toys can be enjoyed at the library or borrowed at no cost. For many families, the L&L is the only free, safe, clean space that offers regular nutritional snacks and opportunities to play. In addition to the activities and snacks, participants can ask questions to a trained family resource specialist, who is available at all L&L hours.

## BABY U

The Baby U Home Visitation program serves at-risk families at the time they need it most by helping to develop effective parenting skills. It is based on the Parents As Teachers and Nurturing Parenting models of home visitation, designed to strengthen families by developing protective factors.

Together, the models address social/emotional competencies for children and parents. A trained Family Resource Specialist conducts intentionally designed home visits customized on the family and children's needs.
