CRIBS


A safe bed for infants, home visitation, resources and safe sleep information for families. Free and available to families at or below 200% of the poverty line.

SERVICE AREA


First Chance provides services in a nine-county radius across mid-Missouri through staff and partner agencies. Services available vary by county and funding opportunities.




Family Demographics

LEND & LEARN

Where kids play to learn and parents learn to play

A free, fun place where parents can play with their children ages 0–5, talk with other parents, and ask trained staff questions about development or other concerns. Toys are available for check out so families can continue to learn and play at home. There are locations with regular hours in Columbia and Centralia, and varying hours in other locations across mid-Missouri.

A fun time for families to spend time with their children and other families, group events are open to everyone and offer it all. At events, families receive child-development information and strategies to use while playing with their children. Additionally, families gain community resource connections and incentives, like books and diapers.

Pilot Program: Raising a Ready Reader

We launched a new campaign to target literacy outcomes at group events and partcipants reported the following:

participating increased their knowledge about the importance of reading with their child



Basic resources for families in need, because we need a little help sometimes

The Baby Bags program acts as a diaper bank and so much more. Families can receive diapers, wipes, health, and safety items along with child development and safety information so they can provide the best care and safety to their children. Items are available at the First Chance office or through one of our partner programs.

What's a Smart Start Kit??

A Smart Start Kit is a diaper bag filled with a few of the basics an infant needs including: a onesie, board book, bathwater thermometer, healthcare kit, home safety kit, and community resource information.

C.R.I.B.S.

Community Resources, Infant Beds, and Support

C.R.I.B.S. provides a safe bed to infants who do not have a safe place to sleep. The crib is delivered to the family home along with six home visits. Home visitors discuss safe sleep, child safety and development, and family well-being to help prevent infant deaths caused by unsafe sleeping practices.

Baby U

Supporting parenting ups and downs prenatally to kindergarten entry

Baby U is a home visiting program supporting families with their specific parenting needs. Using the Nurturing Parenting and Parents as Teachers models, staff walk alongside families with children prenatally through the first semester of kindergarten providing resources, education, and support.






